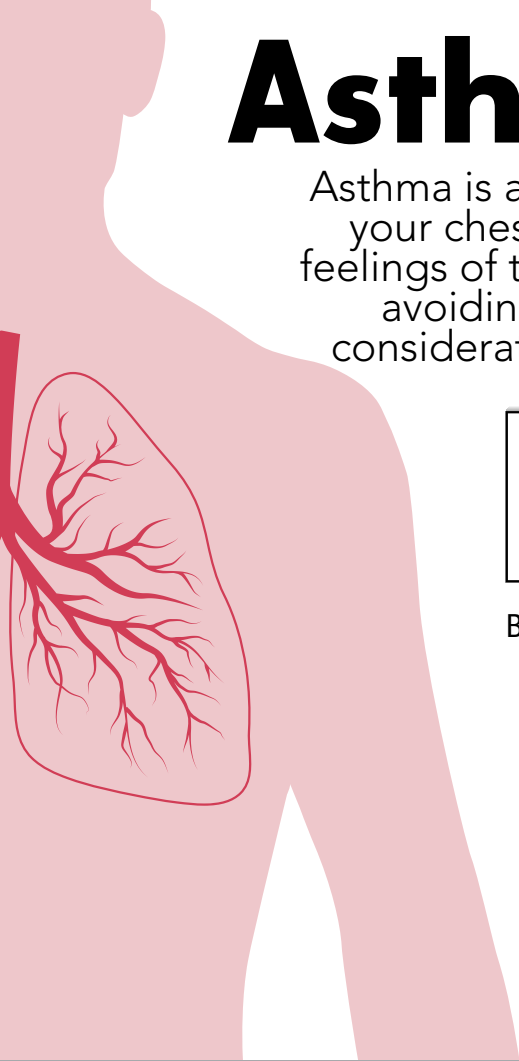
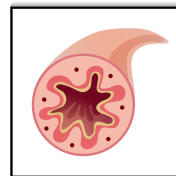


Asthma & Disability

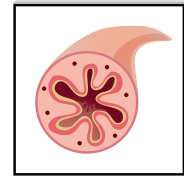
